

cognitive rigor, instruction, and assessment. That's published by Corwin. I have a new book coming out after the first of the year, it's *Shifts in Education for Competency-Based Learning* which again applied Depth of Knowledge to a competency-based system. My co-authors and I talk about evidence-based grading and how you build a student's body of evidence so you have a compelling argument through what you're trying to build. I will be presenting at the Plain Talk About Literacy conference in January, in New Orleans, that's the presentation coming up fairly soon. I tend to work more directly with districts or clusters of districts but in 2020 if you come to my website, you'll be able to see any other workshops where I might be presenting something at a national conference.
